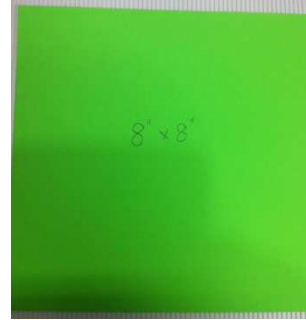
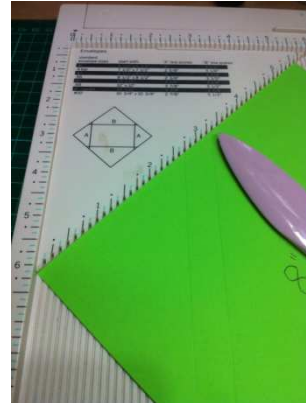


## 4x4 Gift Card Box Using Martha Stewart Scoreboard

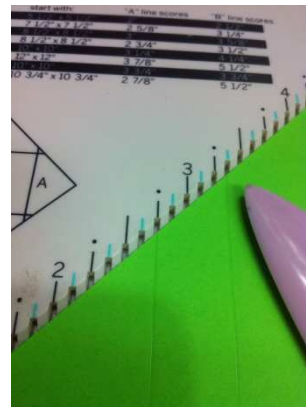
1. Take a piece of patterned paper or cardstock and cut it to 8"x8"



2. Take the envelope guide that comes with your Martha Stewart Scoreboard and place it at the top left of your board – slotted snugly. Placing your paper against the diagonal ruler side with one corner of your cardstock sitting in the bottom left corner as shown

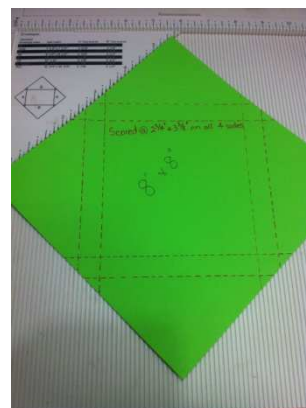


3. Score at  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " and  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " on one side



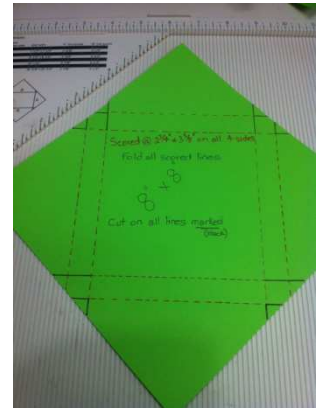
4. Rotate your cardstock once (in any direction) and score again at  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " and  $3\frac{3}{8}$ "

Continue scoring at these two measurement points on **all four sides** of the cardstock

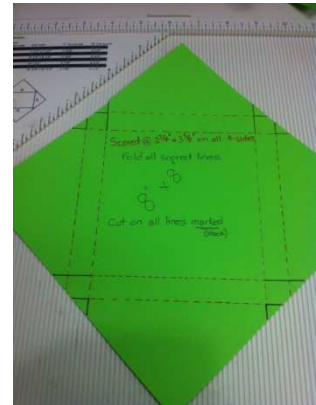


## 4x4 Gift Card Box Using Martha Stewart Scoreboard

- Determine which triangle tip is your top (any will do) and cut both side tabs **down** to the second score line



- Cut the opposite triangle tabs **sideways** to the second scoreline



- Cut away the excess small triangle pieces near the tabs and burnish your score lines really well



- Apply double-sided tape (I suggest Scor-tape or Sticky Strip for strength) to both raw edges of the bottom triangle piece



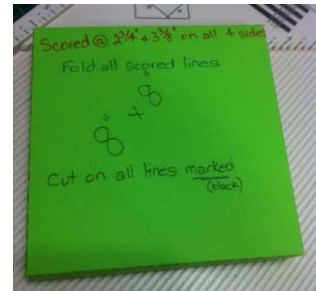
## 4x4 Gift Card Box Using Martha Stewart Scoreboard

9. I don't show it here but it is important to apply adhesive (I prefer wet glue here) on the outside of the bottom side tabs so that they don't obstruct the cards when inserting into the box

10. Assemble your box as shown



11. Now all the hard work is done, start embellishing your gift card box!
